Christmas in the Old West was a difficult time. Pioneers who lived on the prairies often endured savage December winds and blizzards. But early settlers were determined to keep the holidays alive and often decorated their homes with simple Christmas trees and homemade decorations from items they found outside-pinecones, berries, and evergreen branches. Many pioneer women baked weeks ahead of time for the holidays, preparing salt-rising bread, baked beans with salt pork and molasses, vinegar

and dried-apple pies, and fresh game if possible. Gifts were homemade and included corn husk dolls, sachets, carved wooden toys, pillows, and embroidered hankies.

<u>Your turn:</u> What makes family holidays special for you? The Get Smart with Art Students in the classroom in Mesquite, NV all agreed that holidays were special for them because of the time spent with family and friends. They made ornaments and gifts out of recycled cards and scraps of cloth. What kinds of gifts can you make? Have fun and be creative!
